

**TROOP ACTIVITY POLICY AGREEMENT
TROOP 236**

In keeping with safety and acceptable practices for youth organizations, certain items may not be brought on campouts under any circumstances. These include:

- Alcohol
- Non-prescribed Drugs
- Weapons
- Fireworks
- Tobacco
- Pornography

Violation of this policy may result in serious consequences including calling parents to take the Scout home.

Walkmans should not be used except in a scout's tent or while traveling to and from campouts. Campouts are a time to experience nature and the outdoors. Remember that the troop cannot be responsible for damage to or loss of these items. Stereos should not be brought to campouts except on campouts where there has been prior approval.

Part of each campout involves taking proper care of the troop equipment. We, as a troop, have a very large amount of money invested in equipment, and it is essential that we take good care of it. This is also an important part of scouting to help the scout learn responsibility. Scouts and their families should plan to remain at the church for a short time after each campout until the equipment has been properly stored and that equipment which needs to be taken home for cleaning and/or drying has been distributed and documentation made of who has taken each item of equipment home. Rarely families may have another commitment. If you have a commitment which does not permit you to stay, please discuss this with a scoutmaster prior to leaving.

Uniforms MUST be worn to and from all campouts.

Camouflage outfits may not be worn on campouts, except in special circumstances where permission has been granted.

We have read, fully understand, and agree to abide by this policy.
